<p>Course Description:</p> <p>This course provides opportunities for students to communicate and interact in French in structured situations, with a focus on everyday topics, and to apply their knowledge of French in everyday situations. Students will develop listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills introduced in the elementary Core French program, through practical applications and concrete examples, and will use creative and critical thinking skills in various ways. They will also enhance their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities, and will develop skills necessary for lifelong language learning.</p>	<p>Level: Applied</p>

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<p>Course Evaluation: Student Evaluation consists of three components...</p>	
<p>1) Learning Skills & Work Habits:</p> <p>Students are evaluated on 6 Learning Skills & Work Habits. They are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responsibility • Organization • Independent Work • Collaboration • Initiative • Self-Regulation <p>These six attributes are evaluated on a scale of Excellent (E), Good (G), Satisfactory (S) & Needs Improvement (N) and reported on the report card. They are not included in the course mark, unless specified in the curriculum expectations.</p>	
<p>2) Term Mark (Assessment of Learning):</p> <p>Student performance standards for knowledge and skills are described in the curriculum Achievement Chart. The curriculum is assessed in four strands:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening 30% • Speaking 30% • Reading 20% • Writing 20% 	<p>Evaluation of these four strands generates the term mark. The term mark accounts for 70% of the final mark.</p> <p>It is the student's responsibility to submit evidence of learning.</p>
<p>3) Final Evaluation (Assessment of Learning):</p> <p>The final evaluation, administered at or towards the end of the course is based on the evidence shown to the right. The final evaluation accounts for 30% of the final mark.</p>	<p>The final evaluation consists of:</p> <p>Final Evaluation (ISU, listening, speaking & reading) 30 %</p>
